MENTAL HEALTH HEARING OFFICER

DEFINITION

Under general direction, the Mental Health Hearing Officer conducts mental health certification hearings for the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco at hospitals throughout the city of San Francisco pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5250; submits detailed written reports, records, documents and forms to the Court; and performs related duties as required.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

The is a special classification which has responsibility for representing the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco regarding mental health certification.

REPORTS TO

The Presiding Judge and Chief Executive Officer.

CLASSIFICATIONS SUPERVISED

This is not a supervisory class.

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT AND ESSENTIAL DUTIES (The following is used as a partial description and is not restrictive as to duties required.)

Conducts mental health certification hearings; issues orders authorizing intensive treatment related to mental disorder or impairment by chronic alcoholism if the person is a danger to others or to himself or herself, or is gravely disabled; reviews court files, certification documents, medical charts, and related materials to gather appropriate background information; confers with professional staff of concerned agencies, facility representatives providing evaluation services, law enforcement officers, county officials, witnesses and others to secure evidence and information pertaining to any specific case; submits important, timely and detailed written reports, records, documents and forms to the Court; and provides general information to the public, outside agencies, and other concerned parties.

TYPICAL PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Sit for extended periods; frequently stand and walk; travel to medical and mental facilities throughout the city; normal manual dexterity and eye-hand coordination; lift and move objects weighing up to 25 lbs.; corrected hearing and vision to normal range; verbal communication; use of office equipment, including computer, telephone, calculator, copiers, and FAX.

- Prepare comprehensive and concise reports and recommendations related to mental health certification.
- Work effectively with people from a variety of socioeconomic backgrounds.
- Effectively represent the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco with the public, attorneys, petitioners, and representatives of other government agencies and court systems.
- Maintain confidential information when required by legal or ethical standards.
