PROTECTIONS FOR IMMIGRANT VICTIMS

CONSIDERATIONS

- Must be in the US on account of the trafficking
- ▶ Law enforcement encouraged but not required



- 1. Up to four years of temporary nonimmigrant status
- 2. Work authorization
- 3. Federal social services benefits
- 4. Ability to apply for permanent status

CONSIDERATIONS

Perpetrator must be US citizen or Lawful Permanent Resident spouse or parent or US citizen adult son or daughter



If approved, benefit provides:

- 1. Protection from removal
- 2. Work authorization
- 3. Ability to apply for permanent status

T VISA

For victims of trafficking

CONSIDERATIONS

Must fear persecution on account of race. religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in particular social group



If approved, benefit provides:

- 1. Asylee status
- 2. Work authorization
- 3. Federal social services benefits
- 4. Ability to apply for permanent status



- 2. Work authorization
- 3. Ability to apply for permanent status

CONTINUED **PRESENCE**

To apply: ICE - Federal law enforcement must seek this protection for you

CONSIDERATIONS



If approved, benefit provides:

- 1. Protection from removal designation may be granted initially for a period of 2 years and renewed in increments of up to 2 years
- 2. Work authorization
- 3. Access to federal social services benefits
