I want 7 to thank you for the program and for making sure that this opportunity exists. 8 I also want to thank you, Ranon Ross, who works for the 9 10 District Attorney's office, for continuously letting me know 11 progress of what's happening during the program. I want to start off by saying congratulations to all the 12 13 graduates for your hard work, for your determination for which you have done through this process. 14 15 It is very much beneficial to make sure that you have options and opportunity, because the more options that you have, 16 the more opportunity you have, the better decisions you will 17 make and that goes for all of us. 18 19 I just briefly want to talk about the fact that your resume 20 can change. That is something that has resonated with me throughout my entire life and is something that I know can 21 22 happen for you and anybody in this courtroom today. 23 Where you are now, where you are today, where you may have 24 been awhile ago can definitely turn out to be something different. 25 If I was to be in a certain position today based on my past 26 27 resume I wouldn't be standing here before you as the President 28 of the Board of Supervisors.

1 My resume would have read something like: Lives in the 2 projects in West Point or lives in the projects in Potrero Hill.

3 It would have read something like: Raised just by his 4 mother, no father in the home, having to deal with the affects 5 of substance abuse and being in communities where it was hard 6 for a young black male to grow up.

7 It would have read as someone who was suspended from school 8 on a pretty consistent basis, elementary and junior high, to the 9 point where I've been expelled from the school district and 10 Vallejo City Unified more than two times.

11 It would have read: Teenage parent. Someone who had kids 12 before they were 18-years old.

13 It would have read someone who was in and out of juvenile 14 hall growing up. Someone who caught armed robbery case, someone 15 who caught drug cases, someone who caught stolen car cases.

16 It would have read somebody who was not bound for college, 17 but most definitely was bound for death or the penitentiary.

But thank God that we have mentors. Thank God we have programs that are dedicated and committed to exposing young people to opportunities so that they can make changes. That's what the Young Adult Court program has done.

Not only has it allowed you opportunities to think about some of the choices that may have been made in your life, but it also provided you with the uplift and opportunity to have a clean slate from a mistake and a lesson that you've learned. And that goes for all of us.

I have definitely been in a position where I was faced with having to make a choice on what direction I wanted to see for my 1 life and being fortunate enough to have people in my life that 2 were going to make sure that I was able to make a different 3 change.

I'm just excited to see that you all have persevered through this process and this time in your life. I want you to understand that no matter what you have done in your past history you can be whatever you want to be and you can succeed in whatever you want to succeed in.

9 And it's not just a story that I'm telling you because I 10 heard it, because I've read it in the book, which I have, but 11 it's also because I'm a prime example of what can happen if you 12 make different choices.

So, as I started saying, the more options and the more opportunities you have the better choices you make. That is something that I want to resonate with everybody here.

We all go through trials and tribulations in our lives no 16 17 matter what we've done or no matter where we come from or no 18 matter where we've been, but the reason why if I'm faced with adversity, someone gets killed in my family, something happens 19 to one of my children, somebody says something to me on the 20 street that I don't like, the reason why I make a decision 21 22 that's going to keep me free and going to keep me alive is because I have better options and better choices and better 23 24 ways to deal with the issues that I'm confronted with.

25 That's the same for you through this program. It's the same 26 for you through the next steps that you're going to take.

So I'm honored to be here with all of you; honored to bringyou certificates and hand out the completion paperwork.
